Domestic violence is influenced by a variety of issues including trauma, attachment, sexism, racism, class, sexual orientation and so forth. The Conference is designed to create a dialogue among various approaches to interventions with men and women. These approaches include conducting group work as well as having conversations with individuals, couples, and families. These approaches have been influenced by various theoretical frameworks such as feminism, attachment theory, cognitive behavioural theory, post-modernism, psychoanalysis, queer theory and so forth. These interventions have developed out of various locations: community organizations, institutional settings, academic settings, mental health clinics, private practice, correctional offices, shelters and addiction programs.
